

Tawid Grant Accomplishment Report Guidelines

Tawid Bridging Grant
(No more than 3000 words)

As part of the grant's completion requirements, we invite you to submit an accomplishment report. Please respond to the following prompts not as a questionnaire, but by weaving your reflections, experiences, and outcomes. Your narrative should touch upon the following five guiding questions:

1. What was the central aim of your community archiving project, and how did this vision evolve during the course of your work?

Reflect on your initial goals and any shifts that occurred. What new understandings or needs emerged from the community?

2. What methods, tools, and approaches did you use in your archiving process?

Describe the strategies you employed in engaging the community, collecting or preserving materials, and organizing the archive. How did your methodology align with or adapt to the local context?

3. What were the most significant outcomes of the project—for the community, for the archive, and for you as a practitioner?

Consider tangible outcomes (e.g. digital or physical archives, events, exhibitions) as well as intangible impacts (e.g. relationships built, community empowerment, knowledge sharing).

4. What challenges or unexpected developments did you encounter, and how did you address them?

Share any logistical, ethical, technical, or interpersonal hurdles. How did these experiences shape the direction of the project?

5. Looking forward, how do you envision the sustainability, continued use, or expansion of the archive?

Outline any next steps, long-term hopes, or future collaborations. What advice would you give to others doing similar work?

We encourage honesty, critical reflection, and attention to both the successes and complexities of your project. Please feel free to include anecdotes, quotes from participants, or brief descriptions of materials or events that you feel are important.

You may also include graphs, photos, graphics, or other visual materials.
